

Declaration on Data Protection and the Confidentiality of Your Information

The DaLi study “Data. Germany. Digital.” is jointly conducted by the Leibniz-Institut für Bildungsverläufe (LifBi) in Bamberg and the infas Institut für angewandte Sozialwissenschaft in Bonn. Both institutes work in accordance with the statutory data protection provisions.

The study is in the public interest. The selection for participation was made randomly from among all residents born between 2008 and 2013. The name and address of your child were transferred to infas by your municipality on the basis of Section 46 of the Federal Act on Registration. Your child was randomly selected for participation from your municipality's population register. This does not imply that a content-related opinion on the research project is held by your municipality.

The results of the survey will be presented solely in anonymous form, i.e. without names and addresses. This means: No one will be able to tell who provided this information from the results.

This will also apply to the repeat surveys, where it is important to conduct an interview with the same person again after a certain period of time. The statistical evaluations are performed in such a manner that the information from several surveys is only linked to each other by a code number, i.e. without a name and address.

Outside of the LifBi and infas institutes, there will be no disclosure of data whereby you could be identified.

Of course, participation in all surveys is voluntary, and you will not be at a disadvantage if you do not participate. You can withdraw your participation consent at any time and with future effect, without giving reasons.



What will happen to your information?

- 1 or surveys conducted by the infas institute, the following applies: The responses from the interview will only be saved under a code number, separate from names and contact details.
- 2 The names and contact details will remain in the infas institute and will always be kept strictly separate from your responses. infas will employ processors for mailings to you. The names and contact details will be deleted upon conclusion of the survey.
- 3 All responses will be evaluated without names and contact details. For example, all responses to the employment situation will be counted and the percentage results will be calculated from them (see table example).
- 4 The overall result and the results for subgroups are always presented in summarised form (e.g. in tables). Thus, responses of individual persons will not be identifiable.
- 5 **This paragraph applies only to some of the respondents.** infas may only store your contact details if you have consented to the storage of your address for a repeat survey.
- 6 If you have also consented to the disclosure of your contact details to the LfBi, infas may transfer your contact details to the LfBi. Even in repeat surveys, your name and address will always be kept separate from the interview data.
